Dear Mr. Jang:

This letter is in reference to our telephone conversation this morning. First, I spoke with Ms. Brandon this morning about our conversation, and she told me that she communicated to you previously that she felt it was necessary to have everything in writing in this case because of some misrepresentations that were previously made in Court. So, if you have a request, or want to respond to a letter we send to you, we would respectfully request that it be in writing so that there are no misunderstandings, or misrepresentations on either side.

Second, Ms. Brandon communicated to me that she would be happy to extend your discovery responses per your request until 12:00 noon tomorrow. Ms. Brandon is always willing to give an extension on documents when it is necessary without a reason for the extension; therefore, you have until 12:00 noon tomorrow to deliver your discovery responses.

Third, you also said that you were wanting to pick up our client's production at the same time you dropped off your discovery responses. I might need to clear something up. In my letter to you earlier today, the documents I was referring to was Mr. Lynch's personal documents at the marital residence, and not our client's production. Please be advised that Mr. Lynch's personal documents have not been in our possession. Mr. Lynch's personal documents will be ready to be picked up tomorrow before 12:00 noon at the marital residence. Ms. Lynch has a business meeting tomorrow afternoon; therefore, if Mr. Lynch would like to have these documents, he will need to have a courier service pick them up before 12:00 noon tomorrow. Please let us know when Mr. Lynch would like to have a courier service pick these documents up if tomorrow is not convenient.

Our client's production with respect to discovery is available for your review at our office. You may either come to our office and review the production, or you may have a copy service pick the documents up and have the documents copied, and then the copies may be delivered to your office. We will need to know what the name of the copy service is that you will be sending.


