Mr. Wallace,

I am a forensics specialist and a certified expert witness. I specialize in interviewing suspects as well as victims of crimes and abuse. I have interviewed hundreds of people, many of them children. I am an adjunct professor at the University of Houston Downtown CJC. I have taught forensics since 1979 throughout the US and Canada.

I interviewed D on March 04, 2007, and again on March 21, 2007, and I must agree with Dr. Freitag. There are indications that this child has undergone some form of mental conditioning to be apprehensive about his father.

The child has recounted a session, which he attributes to Caryl Dalton, where he was instructed that if he "lived with his father he would never see his mother again." The child also states that his mother reinforced these images. The child also attributes to the therapist and his mother: that he was told that he would not live with his father because his father does not have a house.

Asking the child about these items, or to talk about what happens during visits with Caryl Dalton in general causes the child a great deal of stress and anxiety. However, when his father returned to the office the child immediately became calm.

In my opinion, it would be prudent to investigate all incidents of contact with the the therapist, to further question the motives of the mother, and to keep the child in a positive and safe environment. If you have any questions, don't hesitate to call me.
